

# Notes From the Winemaker

HARVEST. While a cool spring has kept canopy growth in check, a hotter than normal July has surged the plant maturity forward, and we are now estimating a harvest beginning in the second week of September. Despite total heat units approaching the 1998 vintage, we are still slightly behind 2001, and that is good news in terms of reaching full maturity with longer hang time. We are fruit thinning now to reduce yields to below 4 tons per acre.

TRIPLE RED FOCUS. Washington has been recognized as one of the leading producers of premium Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon, and Syrah in the world. With the exceptional quality of fruit available to us, look to L'Ecole No 41 to expand production of Cabernet Sauvignon and Syrah.



VALLEY NEWS. Ground-breaking for Walla Walla Community College's Institute for Enology and Viticulture is planned for early fall. The \$3.2 million teaching and training facility will feature a fully functional 1,200 case winery as well as traditional classrooms, labs, and hospitality areas. Associated with the facility, the College also will have a ten acre teaching vineyard. 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### SEPTEMBER 2002 Wine Releases

### 2001 Columbia Valley "Barrel Fermented" Semillon - \$14

Remarkably brilliant and buoyed by crisp acidity, this wine shows loads of ripe citrus layered nicely with floral notes of orange blossom, honeysuckle and sweet nectar. Composed of 89% Semillon and 11% Sauvignon Blanc, this wine is a blend from Klipsun, Yakima Bend Ranch, Charbonneau and Seven Hills Vineyard.

### 2001 Seven Hills Vineyard Estate Semillon - \$19

100% Semillon from our estate grown fruit at Seven Hills Vineyard, this wine is packed with complex fruit flavors of green apple, pear, melon and papaya. Rich and creamy flavors of nutmeg, vanilla and custard unfold gracefully and linger on a satisfying finish.

### 2001 Columbia Valley Chardonnay - \$19

Ripe and elegant, this Burgundian style Chardonnay shows rich and lively tropical fruit flavors of banana, pineapple and mango with subtle mineral and spice that build in complexity and gain nuance through the finish.

### 2000 Walla Walla Valley Merlot - \$32

A blend of Pepper Bridge and Seven Hills Vineyard, this wine is 75% Merlot, 19% Cabernet Sauvignon and 6% Cabernet Franc. This merlot is not for the faint of heart. It is pure L'Ecole Nº 41 style - rich, full-bodied and spicy. Cascading aromas of spicy cinnamon, nutmeg, orange peel and cranberry meld flawlessly with the intense bright fruit flavors of black cherry, plum and smoky notes on a long balanced finish.
